

## Performing in the Festival of Community Theatre

2007 was the second year I gave a group of my students the opportunity to take part in Theatre Federation's annual Festival of Community Theatre.

In 2006 we participated with the play *Juvie* by Jerome McDonough and we were extremely fortunate to go through to the South Island Regional in Christchurch after winning the District Festival in Westport.

It was exhilarating for the students, parents and for me as their teacher. They worked hard after that first 'round' and repeated the success in Christchurch where we won again to move on to the National Final in Palmerston North! It was unbelievable particularly as our cast were so very young compared to most of the other participants.

We had a terrific time leading up to the Nationals, had to do a lot of fundraising to get there and then had a lovely time watching the other plays, striking up new friendships with fellow actors and of course there was time for some shopping in the North Island.

In 2007 we entered again. Two boys remained from the year before's cast and we had five new actors who had not had the experience yet.

It was very hard to find a play that was of the same class as *Juvie*. I decided to write a play myself. It was an old idea that I had worked on before and I adapted it as well as I could (Ed note: this play won the Olga Harding Playwriting Award!) to suit my, again, young cast of seven.

The Third Floor a black comedy/thriller/ theatre of the absurd on the madness of war was the result and it proved to be quite challenging for these actors. They worked hard and did very well indeed winning Award for Best Ensemble Play at the District Festival in Christchurch under the adjudication of Bryan Aitken.

Alas we didn't go forward this time but that was okay because we could all see why the other plays were better and we received an excellent adjudication with which we could be totally in agreement. There were some fantastic plays in the festival, in particular a play by the senior drama students of Aranui High School who performed a modern adaptation of Romeo and Juliet. They went right through to the National Final in Dunedin.

It has been an educational experience for my students and they can't wait to take part again this year.

## **NZTF May Ives Library Relocated**

New Zealand Theatre Federation's May Ives Library has relocated to

Room 110 Square Edge Arts Centre 52 – 56 The Square P O Box 329 Palmerston North 4440

The Square Edge Arts Centre is an art deco style building which was originally built as the Municipal Building for the Palmerston North City Council and, therefore, has a rich history. After Palmerston North's new Civic Complex was completed in the late seventies, Square Edge was opened as an Arts Centre in 1981. Last year the ground floor was renovated and there are a number of boutique art shops, exhibition and gallery spaces. Out the back, in what is described as the Courtyard area, the original stables have been renovated to accommodate businesses like Creative Journeys and the Arts Recycling Centre.

The first floor, where New Zealand Theatre Federation's May Ives Library is situated, is mainly office space and small studios for visual artists. The top floor has large studios that are used for dance, drama, yoga classes and the like.

On one side of the library is the former Council Chambers (now used as a performance space for a great variety of activities and events, including music, singing and drama exams. On the other side is the former Mayor's office, which now accommodates the Palmerston North Community Arts Council. Almost directly across the corridor from the May Ives Library is the National Office of the Speech Communication Association which is in the powder-room originally designed for the Mayoress of the city.

The actual room in which the May Ives Library is housed has been renovated over the last twenty five or so years. Part of it, though, which is still intact is the original vault. (This was probably where rates payments were kept.) It is in this vault that the reference books, archives and original scripts will be stored.

There is a very close link with this building and NZTF. The late Jannat Aitchison was the Manager of Square Edge for many years prior to her return to Christchurch to take up the position of NZTF Administrator and Librarian. In her role as Manager, she lived in the penthouse apartment at the top of the building.

The NZTF May Ives Library is an extremely valuable national resource. It is a true taonga, unique in New Zealand. Not only are there valuable reference books that cover stage management, lighting, costume, make-up, acting, voice, theatre practitioners, playwrights, theatre history and much, much more, but many of these books have been donated by theatre luminaries or their families. There is quite a collection of books from the library of the late Joey Mountjoy. (He was married at one stage to Zenocrate Graham who was instrumental in the growth of Khandallah Arts Theatre – Ed's note) Some of the historical material goes back as far as the beginnings of the British Drama League, the New Zealand Drama Council and, more recently, the formation of New Zealand Theatre Federation.

When the many boxes arrived late last year, it seemed that it would be a simple task to physically stack the scripts straight onto the shelves. However, as each box was opened it became evident that the packers had not removed the books from the shelves in an obvious alphabetical order. Not only did the books require stacking, but they had to be sorted first. We were very fortunate, though, to have volunteers assist with this process. Peter Doherty put up the shelving, Alan Cox assisted putting the scripts on the shelves as his wife Ann Cox assisted with cataloguing.

The shelving forwarded from Christchurch was insufficient for the numerous scripts held by the library. There are 1679 titles in the catalogue. Multiply this number by the number in the cast of each play to provide a production set, and many scripts have more than one production set, and this will give you some idea of the numbers of scripts that have been handled. This excludes the reference texts, the cassettes, programmes, and booklets celebrating New Zealand's theatre anniversaries and international theatre events.

Until further notice Sheridan Hickey is the Library Manager (in a voluntary capacity) and will be supervising a team of volunteers who will assist with tasks like restacking returned scripts, repairing and mending scripts among various other required duties.

It is serendipitous that the space now occupied by the NZTF May Ives Library became vacant at the time it did. I am sure that NZTF's long time former Administrator and Librarian, arranged this in her indomitable manner for the benefit of all NZTF members and the wider theatre going community.

Currently a marketing strategy to promote the services and new location of the library is planned and the first public thrust will occur at this year's Manawatu District's Globe Awards to be held at the Globe Theatre, Palmerston North, Friday 29<sup>th</sup> February.

The mission of the NZTF May Ives Library is:

- To focus on providing script hireage of plays (one act and full length); musicals and pantomimes written and created by New Zealanders.
- To assist develop a wide network of users through schools, theatre groups, and individuals

To operate the library using best practice in a professional manner

Although initially the official open hours will be limited, requests and orders can be placed any time via email, fax, or voice mail.

- That only one nomination may be made by a society in any one year.


